Project Description:

Replace Bridge No. 79 over Grassy Creek on SR 1328 (Kirby Lackey Road) in Alexander County. The area of potential effects is 75 feet either side from the centerline of the roadway/bridge and 300 feet from either end of the bridge. Project length is approximately 500 feet. Proposed right-of-way may vary; the existing right-of-way is 60 feet from ditch line to ditch line maintained. There will be an off-site detour.

SUMMARY OF HISTORIC ARCHITECTURE AND LANDSCAPES REVIEW

Description of review activities, results, and conclusions:

Review of HPO quad maps, HPOweb GIS mapping, historic designations roster, and indexes was conducted on 8/20/13. Based on this review, there are no existing NR, SL, LD, DE, or SS properties in the Area of Potential Effects (APE). Built in 1963, Bridge No. 79 has not been evaluated for listing to the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) according to the NCDOT Historic Bridge Inventory, however, it appears to be a standard bridge design of no outstanding architectural or architectural significance. Alexander County GIS mapping and property records revealed no properties over the age of fifty years old within the project APE. The APE lies northwest of the Taylorsville in Alexander County and consists of mostly forested areas dotted with patches of farmland and residences. Thus, a survey is not required for this project.

Why the available information provides a reliable basis for reasonably predicting that there are no unidentified significant historic architectural or landscape resources in the project area:

HPO quad maps, HPOweb GIS mapping, Google Street View, Google maps and Alexander County property records are considered valid tools for the purposes of determining the likelihood of historic resources being present. A survey is not required for this project.
