<u>Project Description:</u> Replace Bridge No. 14 over Cub Creek on SR 1746 (Cub Creek Circle) in Burke County. Area of potential effects is 75 feet either side from the centerline of the roadway/bridge and 300 feet from either end of the bridge. Project length is approximately 500 feet. The existing right-of-way is 60 feet from ditch line to ditch line maintained and the proposed right of way may vary. There will be an off-site detour.			

SUMMARY OF HISTORIC ARCHITECTURE AND LANDSCAPES REVIEW

Description of review activities, results, and conclusions:

Review of HPO quad maps, HPOweb GIS mapping, historic designations roster, and indexes was conducted on 8/22/13. Based on this review, there are no existing NR, SL, LD, DE, or SS properties in the Area of Potential Effects (APE). Built in 1955, Bridge No. 14 is not eligible for listing to the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) according to the NCDOT Historic Bridge Inventory. It appears that only 2-3 parcels fall into the APE but no actual physical structures sit within the APE. Burke County GIS mapping and property records did not provide year-built dates for its properties; however, none within the APE appear to have the architectural or historical significance needed to merit consideration for eligibility to the NRHP. This is further confirmed by Google Street View imagery. The APE lies south of I-40 near the Abee community in Burke County and consists of mostly forested mountainous areas dotted with patches of farmland and residences. Thus, a survey is not required for this project.

Why the available information provides a reliable basis for reasonably predicting that there are no unidentified significant historic architectural or landscape resources in the project area:

HPO quad maps, HPOweb GIS mapping, Google Street View, Google maps and Burke County property records are considered valid tools for the purposes of determining the likelihood of historic resources being present. A survey is not required for this project.

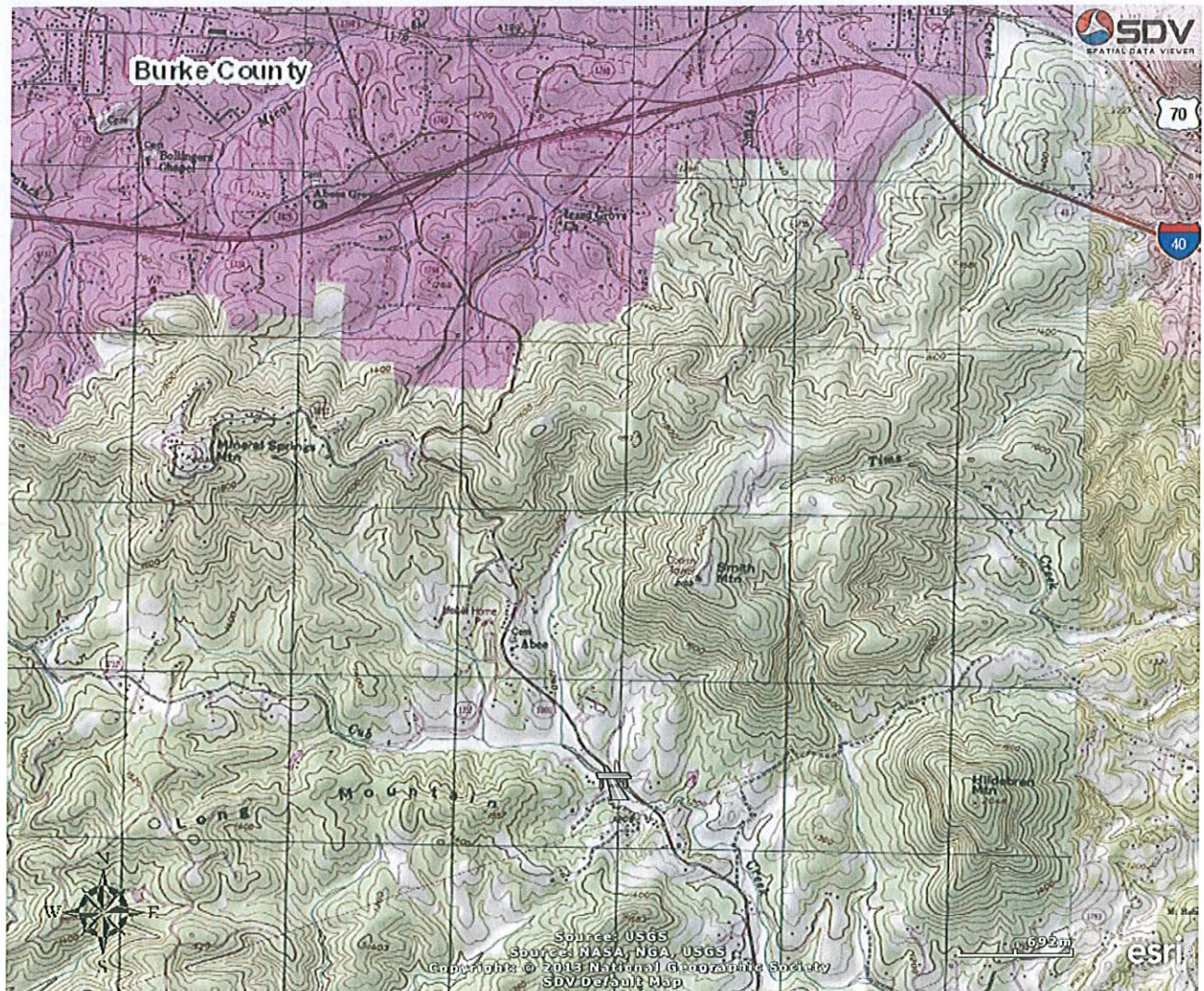


Bridge No. 14 on Cub Creek Circle, Burke County, courtesy of Google Street View.

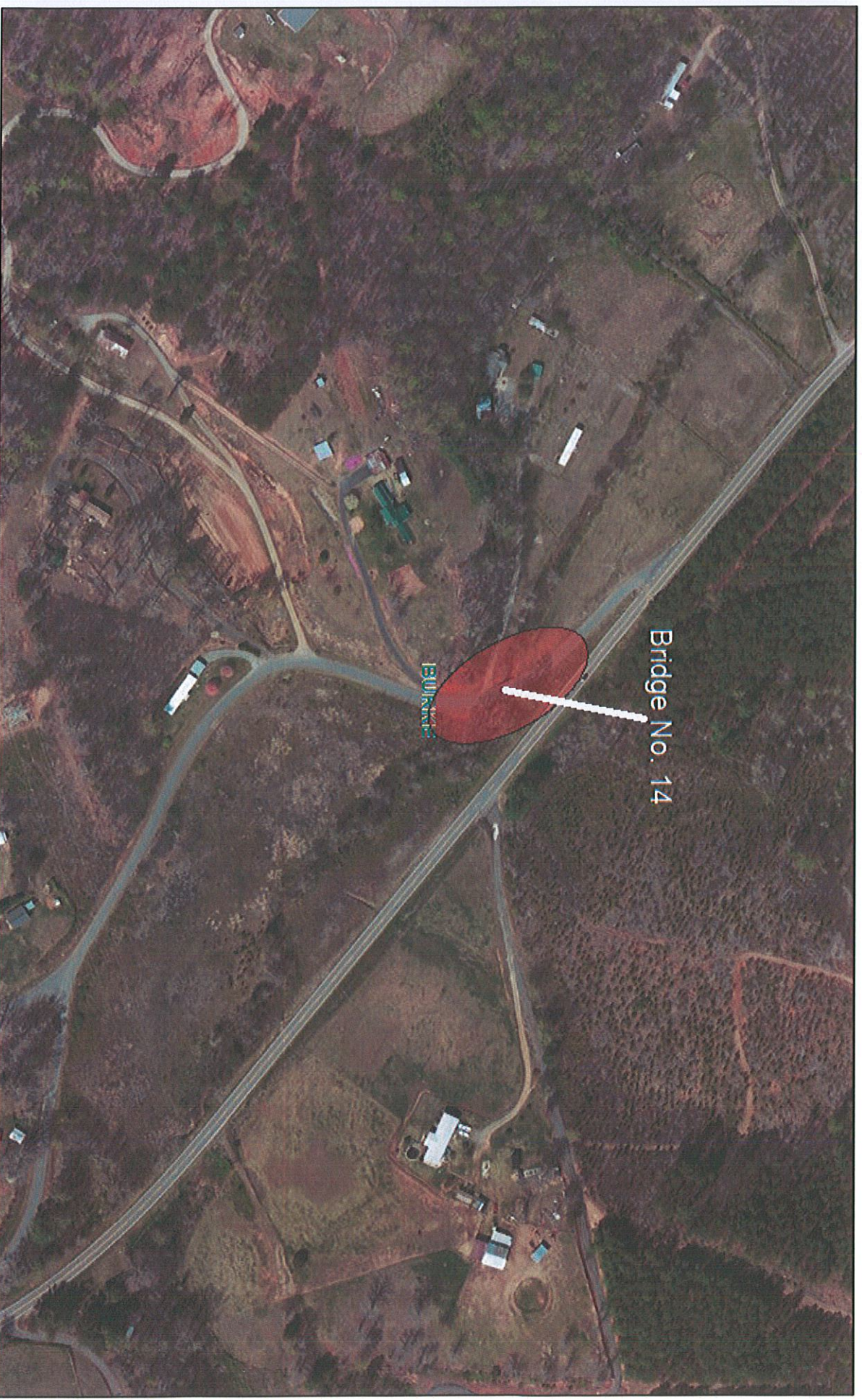


Houses and structures on one parcel falling within APE, Cub Creek Circle, Burke County, courtesy of Google Street View.
