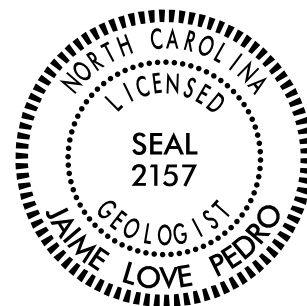

SOIL CLASSIFICATION IS BASED ON THE AASHTO SYSTEM. 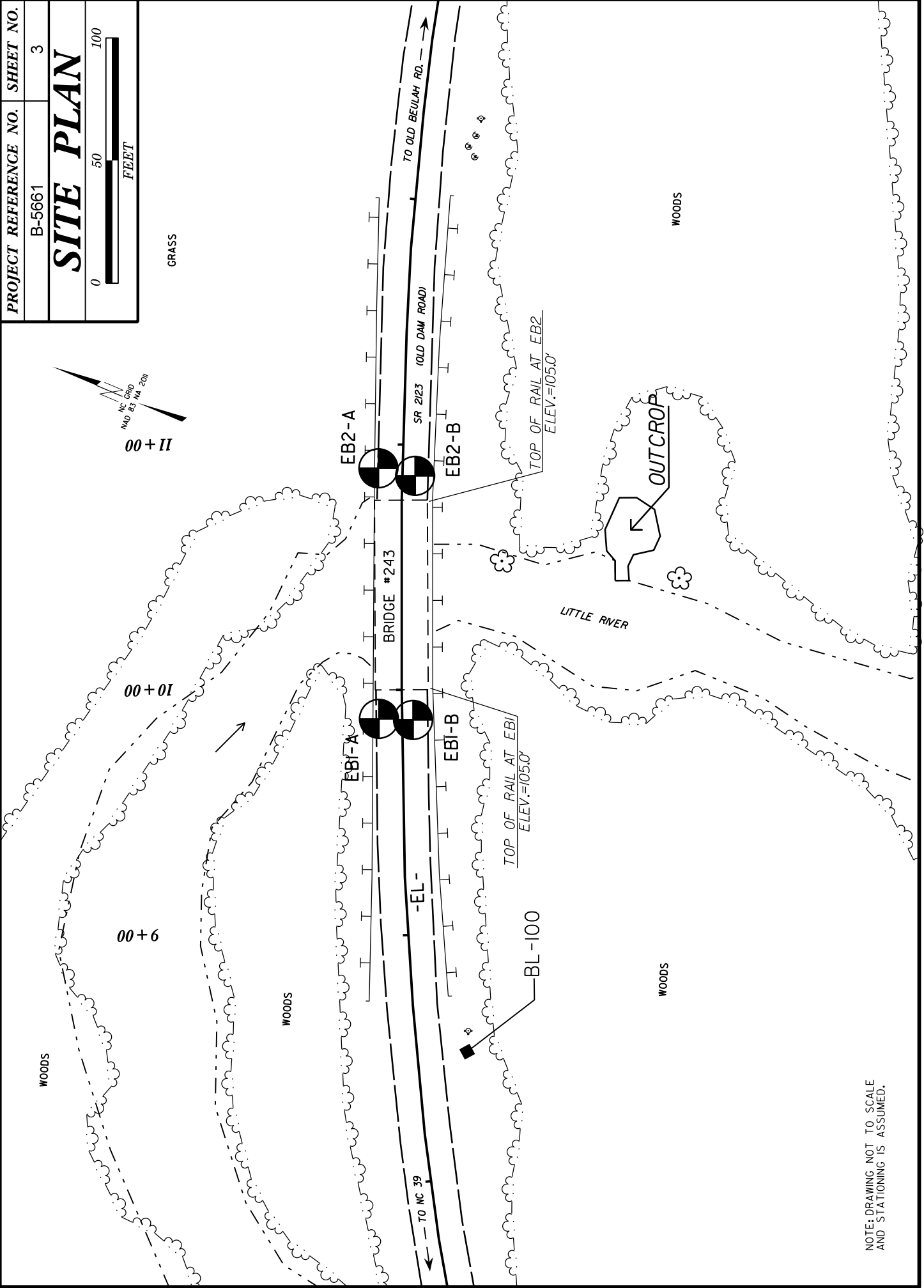
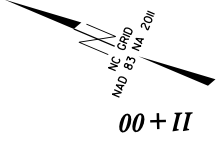
