ROCK CONTINUITY

Sound - Core pieces larger than 8 inches.

Slightly Fractured (SLI. FRAC.) - Core pieces between 4 and 8 inches.

Moderately Fractured (MOD. FRAC.) - Core pieces between 1 and 4 inches.

Extremely Fractured (EXT. FRAC.) - Core pieces less than 1 inch.

JOINT SPACING

Average Discontinuity Spacing (ADS)

The average measured distance (in feet) between joints in the same set. Will not apply to individual joints.

JOINT THICKNESS

Average Discontinuity Thickness (ADT)
The average thickness or width of gap in the joint.
