

To Whom It May Concern:

On May 3, 2013, the Inactive Hazardous Sites Branch (Branch) sent you a Notice of Regulatory Requirements (NORR) letter because contamination was found on your properties located at 101 East Tenth Street and/or 223 West Tenth Street, Greenville, NC during a recent investigation conducted by the NC DOT. Since that time, the owner of the property identified as a likely source of the contamination on your property has entered into an agreement with DENR's Dry Cleaning Solvent Cleanup Act (DSCA) Program. Under this Program, assessment and cleanup of the contamination will be performed on the source parcel and other affected parcels. Costs for the work will be paid for by the DSCA Program and the owner of the source property. Therefore, unless there is a change in status with the DSCA agreement or further assessment determines that contamination on your property is not from former dry cleaning operations, the Branch considers your property to be part of the DSCA Program site. No further response to the NORR is required at this time.
