
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Approval – Resolution for Detective Monroe Boggs

Upon a recommendation of the Road Naming Committee, a motion was made by Board Member Lakey and seconded by Board Member Dennis and the vote was unanimous to approve the following:

WHEREAS, Detective Clinton Monroe Boggs moved to Surry County in 1958 where he and his wife raised two children; and

WHEREAS, Detective Clinton Monroe Boggs served as a deputy for the Surry County Sheriff's Department for approximately 15 months prior to becoming a police officer for the city of Mount Airy; and

WHEREAS, Detective Clinton Monroe Boggs was conducting a vehicle stop of a stolen vehicle along U.S. 52 North near the twin bridges over N.C. 89 when he was shot and killed; and

WHEREAS, Detective Clinton Monroe Boggs was killed on February 25, 1971, and was the second Mount Airy Police Officer to lose his life in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, the Surry County Board of Commissioners and the city of Mount Airy requested the North Carolina Department of Transportation honor Detective Clinton Monroe Boggs for his loyal and faithful service to the citizens of Surry County.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:
