

THE DR. CHARLES RICHARD DREW MEMORIAL HIGHWAY

WHEREAS, Dr. Charles Richard Drew pioneered the preservation of blood plasma thus saving thousands of lives in World War II; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Charles Richard Drew served as Medical Director of the first American Red Cross blood bank in this country, a program that became the model for blood banks in the American Red Cross blood collection program; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Charles Richard Drew achieved further distinction in the training of qualified black surgeons for the teaching and practice of surgery at a time when there was a severe shortage of black surgeons; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Charles Richard Drew fought against racial injustice; and


WHEREAS, Dr. Charles Richard Drew lost his life on April 1, 1950 due to an automobile accident on NC-49 in Alamance County at which site a memorial marker has been placed; and

WHEREAS, the County of Alamance has endorsed the nomination and recognition of a portion of NC-49 in Alamance County as the "Dr. Charles Richard Drew Memorial Highway."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the section of NC-49 in the township of Haw River from Bason Road north to the Alamance – Orange county line is hereby designated as the "Dr. Charles Richard Drew Memorial Highway."
- 2. That the Department of Transportation is ordered to erect appropriate signs at a suitable time.
