Approval of Engineering Agreement Between State Highway Commission and Corps of Engineers - Project 6.801829, Chatham County

Chief Engineer Davis advised the US Corps of Engineers will replace section of US 64 (2 lanes) in Chatham County affected by the New Hope Reservoir Project. Further, it has been deemed feasible to construct a 4-lane divided facility prior to flooding the reservoir area. The Corps of Engineers has agreed to include the 2 additional lanes in their construction contract, estimated cost of which is \$1,500,000, provided an agreement is entered into by the State Highway Commission and the Corps of Engineers whereby the Commission agrees to bear the cost of same, including pro rata share of preliminary engineering, construction engineering and construction - Project 6.801829.

Accordingly, a motion was made by Commissioner Ellis, seconded by Commissioner Joyce, and the vote was unanimous that the Commission enter into an agreement with the Corps of Engineers whereby the Corps will construct (on a reimbursable basis) 2 additional lanes on section of US 64 in Chatham County, in connection with the New Hope Reservoir Project.

Approval - Naming of a Bridge in Belmont in Honor of Harley B. Gaston

In accordance with Resolution adopted by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Belmont, State Highway Administrator Willoughby recommended that bridge crossing the Southern Railway tracks, part of the Park Street Extension, in Belmont, be named in honor of Harley B. Gaston, who served the City as City Clerk, Treasurer and City Attorney for 46 years.

Therefore, acting on Mr. Willoughby's recommendation, a motion was made by Commissioner Maxwell, seconded by Commissioner Whitmire, and the vote was unanimous that bridge crossing the Southern Railway tracks, Park Street Extension project, in Belmont be named in honor of Harley B. Gaston.
