## Acceptance - Ferry Committee Report

October 2, 1969 Meeting

Commissioner Ragsdale, Chairman of the Ferry Committee, stated he and members of his Committee met Friday, September 12th, together with Mr. Hugh Salter, Ferry Operations Manager, and formulated the following report relative to improving ferry service, and recommended its acceptance.

Accordingly, a motion was made by Commissioner Nowell, seconded by Commissioner Tripp, and the vote was unanimous that the Ferry Report be accepted.

- 1. That the Fort Fisher Ferry crew be brought up to Coast Guard standards. This can be accomplished with no additional cost to the Commission.
- 2. That additional ramps and docking facilities be built at Ocracoke before the completion of the Emerald Isle bridge, since we understand that an
