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

Be it resolved by the Nash County Board of Commissioners that as a part of Nash County's Bicentennial efforts it is hereby requested that the N. C. Board of Transportation and N. C. Secondary Roads Council name the following bridges in Nash County:

- 095 Bridge # 56, over the Tar River on SR 1544 be named Lamon's Ferry Bridge.
- 096 Bridge # 116, which crosses Stony Creek on SR 1544 be named Hunter's Bridge.
- and Bridge # 48-32-10 which crosses Swift Creek on N. C. 48 at Gold Rock be named Clinches Bridge.
 - Bridge # 48-32-30 which is over Fishing Creek on N. C. 48 be named Culpepper's Bridge.

Be it further resolved that the N. C. Department of Transportation and N. C. Secondary Roads Council provide and erect two signs on each bridge, one from each approach, so designating them.
