RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Rotary Club of Randleman has requested the Board of Transportation to designate the twin bridges on US 220 Bypass near Randleman as the **MARTHA McGEE BELL BRIDGE^S**; and

WHEREAS, The request of the Rotary Club has been endorsed by the Randolph County Commissioners, the City of Randleman, the City of Asheboro, the Asheboro-Randolph Chamber of Commerce, and the Randolph County Historical Society; and

WHEREAS, Martha McGee Bell was a Revolutionary War heroine and made her home in the Deep River Community which became a part of Randolph County; and

WHEREAS, The loyalty of Martha McGee Bell continues to be admired by those who love freedom and take pride in the contributions made by others in the early struggle to preserve liberty for all the people of our Nation; and

WHEREAS, A tangible acknowledgement of the efforts and sacrifices of Martha McGee Bell in her fight for the cause of freedom is deemed appropriate in order to permanently perpetuate her memory:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED That the **twin bridges over Deep River on the US 220 Bypass near Randleman** be designated as the **MARTHA McGEE BELL BRIDGES**; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That appropriate signs be erected on the roadway approach to each bridge so designating each bridge as the MARTHA McGEE BELL BRIDGE.
