REQUEST FOR NAMING OF PORTION OF NC 160, MECKLENBURG COUNTY

Our Department of Transportation has completed a relocation of NC 160 around Charlotte's Douglas Airport in Mecklenburg County.

The Mecklenburg County Board of Commissioners has adopted a resolution requesting the Board of Transportation to name the relocated portion of NC 160 in honor of Paul Brown, who was one of the original settlers of the Steel Creek Community through which NC 160 is located.

The North Carolina General Statutes give the Board of Transportation the power to name highways which are a part of the State Highway System. It is the policy of the Board of Transportation to give consideration to names for highway facilities when the local governing bodies have officially requested and endorsed a proposed name.

It is recommended that the Board of Transportation name the portion of the NC 160 ~~relocation~~ from the existing Charlotte municipal corporate limits westerly as the **PAUL BROWN HIGHWAY** and authorize the Department to erect appropriate signs. *BOULEVARD*
