A Resolution for the Richard B. Humphrey Bridge

Whereas, the late Richard B. Humphrey was born in Robeson County, and was a lifelong resident of the state of North Carolina; and

Whereas, Richard B. Humphrey was bequeathed by his father, at the age of three, over 1,000 acres of land; and

Whereas, Richard B. Humphrey adroitly managed his resources; and

Whereas, Richard B. Humphrey in the last years of his short life accumulated nearly 4,000 acres of land; and

Whereas, Richard B. Humphrey just seven months before his 29th birthday died during the typhoid epidemic in 1846; and

Whereas, Richard B. Humphrey left his entire estate to his only surviving daughter Ann Eliza, who married Dr. Warren Williams; and

Whereas, the Humphrey-Williams Estate is recognized by the USDA as a National Bicentennial Farm; and

Whereas, the Humphrey-Williams House is listed in the National Register; and

Whereas, the Richard B. Humphrey Bridge would complement the preservation efforts of the historic site.

Now therefore, be it hereby resolved that:
