A RESOLUTION FOR UNITED STATES SENATOR JESSE HELMS

WHEREAS, United States Senator Jesse Helms is a native of Monroe, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Senator Helms served in the United States Navy in World War II; and

WHEREAS, Senator Helms was elected to the United States Senate in 1972 where he has served with distinction for the past 20 years; and

WHEREAS, Senator Helms was instrumental in securing funding for many highway projects essential to the well being of the citizens of North Carolina.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the section of U.S. 74 from the U.S. 601 intersection in Monroe to the Anson-Union County line be dedicated in honor of Senator Jesse Helms until such time as the U.S. 74 Monroe Bypass (R-2559) is opened. At that time the U.S. 74 Monroe Bypass will be named the "Senator Jesse Helms Freeway" for his untiring devotion to the citizens of North Carolina and to the United States of America.

That project R-2559 (the U.S. 74 Monroe Bypass) be known in all documentation from this point forward as the "Senator Jesse Helms Freeway."

That signs appropriate for such a dedication be erected by the North Carolina Department of Transportation.
