WHEREAS, Senator Robert Warren was born in Sampson County on July 22, 1928; and

WHEREAS, Senator Robert Warren graduated from the Sampson County school system; and

WHEREAS, Senator Robert Warren received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Agriculture Education from North Carolina State College in 1950 and a Masters Degree in Education from North Carolina State University in 1968; and

WHEREAS, Senator Robert Warren served as Director of the Drivers License Section of the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles for three years; and

WHEREAS, Senator Robert Warren represented Johnston and Sampson counties in the North Carolina Senate from 1981 through 1988; and

WHEREAS, Senator Robert Warren served as Chairman of the Senate Transportation Committee, Co-Chairman of the Transportation Oversight Committee and on many transportation study commissions; and

WHEREAS, Senator Robert Warren introduced and helped enact the “Seatbelt Bill”, which has saved the lives of thousands of citizens in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the Johnston County and the Sampson County Boards of commissioners requested the North Carolina Department of Transportation to honor Senator Robert Warren.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the North Carolina Board of Transportation designates Interstate 40 from 2.5 miles east of the Johnston County-Sampson County line in Sampson County to 2.5 miles west of the Sampson County-Johnston County line in Johnston County as the **Senator Robert Warren Highway** for his outstanding service to the citizens of Johnston and Sampson counties and the State of North Carolina.

That appropriate signs be erected at a suitable time.
