The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hundley, and unanimously carried.

Approval - Revisions in 1967-69 Capital Improvements Budget, Code No. 66773

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Acting on the recommendation of Assistant Chief Engineer Hardesty, it was moved by Commissioner McNair that the Commission approve the following revisions in the 1967-69 Capital Improvements Budget, Code No. 66773. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Matthews, and unanimously carried.

1. Reduce Item No. 46 (District Engineer's Office at Lumberton) in the amount of \$52,000.00 and set up a substitute new number in a like amount for the purpose of constructing a District Shop in Fayetteville, Cumberland County.
2. Reduce Item No. 64 (greasing and washing facility in Avery County) in the amount of \$20,000.00 and set up new item in a like amount to cover the purchase of property on which to construct new maintenance facilities in Avery County.
3. Reduce Item No. 9 (truck shed and storage building in Kenansville) in the amount of \$12,000.00 and set up a new item in a like amount to cover the construction of an office building for the Bridge Maintenance Department in Kenansville.

Approval - Naming of Seven-Mile Section of NC-770 between Eden and Stoneville, Rockingham County, "The T. Clarence Stone Highway"

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Commissioner Harrington at this time praised and lauded Mr. T. Clarence Stone of Stoneville, North Carolina, for his

Clarence Stone Highway". The motion was seconded by Commissioner Murphy, and unanimously carried. The membership of the Commission then stood and gave Mr. Stone a standing vote of thanks for his outstanding record of public service.
