WHEREAS, Tom McRimmon was a successful and innovative farmer; and

WHEREAS, Tom McRimmon established two grist mills, a cotton gin, sawmill and recreational areas on property his family purchased on both sides of Shoe Heel Creek in the Alfordsville Township in Robeson County; and

WHEREAS, Tom McRimmon owned and managed the property until his death in 1990; and

WHEREAS, Tom McRimmon was active in civic and community affairs, having been instrumental in securing a community sponsored softball field, complete with lights; and

WHEREAS, Tom McRimmon was a long-time director with the Robeson County Federal Land Bank and a lifelong member of the Midway Presbyterian Church, where he served as treasurer, deacon and elder; and

WHEREAS, Tom McRimmon was an advocate for education and served as a member of the Rowland School Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Robeson County Board of Commissioners request the North Carolina Department of Transportation honor this civic-minded Robeson County citizen, innovative farmer and businessman.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved:
