**Approval – Resolution for Trooper Anthony G. Cogdill**

Upon a recommendation from the Road Naming Committee, a motion was made by Board Member Burrell and seconded by the entire Board to approve the following:

**WHEREAS**, Anthony G. Cogdill was born March 12, 1971 in Waynesville in Haywood County, North Carolina; and

**WHEREAS**, Anthony G. Cogdill graduated from Tuscola Senior High School in Haywood County; and

**WHEREAS**, Anthony G. Cogdill was sworn in as a member of the North Carolina State Highway Patrol on March 20, 1998 and was assigned to Winston-Salem in Forsyth County; and

**WHEREAS**, Anthony G. Cogdill was transferred to Waynesville in Haywood County in June 2000; and

**WHEREAS**, Anthony G. Cogdill was killed in the line of duty on May 30, 2003 during a traffic stop on the eastbound lanes of Interstate 40 between mile markers 25 and 26 in Haywood County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Haywood County Board of Commissioners requested the North Carolina Department of Transportation honor Trooper Cogdill.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:**

That the North Carolina Board of Transportation names the bridge on N.C. 209 over Interstate 40 in Haywood County the **Anthony G. Cogdill Memorial Bridge** for his outstanding service and dedication to his community, region and state.

That appropriate signs be erected at a suitable time.
