# STIP Manager Report: STI Summary

#### **NCDOT STIP**

The N.C. Department of Transportation's long-range transportation plan – called the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) – identifies the construction funding and schedule for state transportation projects over a 10-year period. NCDOT updates the STIP approximately every two years. The data-driven process to update the STIP is called <a href="Strategic Prioritization">Strategic Prioritization</a>. ### **STI Summary**

STIP Manager provides the user with a web-based interface to view, enter, and edit data associated with the NCDOT Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Modules are included to allow users to add and manage projects, input funding information, and to process STIP revisions through an automated workflow. Additional reporting and analysis features are included.

The STI Summary report aggregates Strategic Transportation Investments, grouped by transportation Mode, Funding Program, then STI Funded Category, for a STIP and Revision (if applicable). Mode, Funding Program, and STI Funded Category filters are available as report configuration options. The report contains the number of projects and Total Programmed amount for each Funding Program listed under the transportation mode.
