A.	A. <u>Project Description, Location, and Purpose</u> : This project replaces bridge number 780176 on SR 1700 (Fisher Hill Road) over NC 14/NC 87 in Rockingham County (NCDOT Division 7). The existing bridge is a deteriorating fifty-six-year-old bridge with a low posted weight limit. The new bridge will have two 11-foot lanes and 4-foot shoulders (). The bridge will be replaced on the existing alignment. During construction, traffic will be detoured onto the existing loop/ramp in the northwest quadrant of the SR 1700/NC 14-87 intersection; NC 14-87; Old NC 87; and NC 700 back to SR 1700. The detour is about 3.2 miles.
