A. Project Description:

This project replaces Rockingham County Bridge number 780176 on SR 1700 (Fisher Hill Road) over NC 14/NC 87 (NCDOT Division 7). The bridge will be replaced on the existing alignment while detouring traffic offsite (see Figure 1 for vicinity map and Figure 2 for offsite detour).

B. <u>Description of Need and Purpose:</u>

The purpose of this project is to address a deteriorating fifty-six-year-old bridge with a low posted weight limit.

C. Categorical Exclusion Action Classification:

Type I(A) - Ground Disturbing Action

D. Proposed Improvements:

28. Bridge rehabilitation, reconstruction, or replacement or the construction of grade separation to replace existing at-grade railroad crossings, if the actions meet the constraints in 23 CFR 771.117(e)(1-6).

E. Special Project Information:

Offsite Detour

The proposed off-site detour for the bridge replacement project will use the existing loop in the northwest quadrant of the grade-separated intersection. The detour is approximately 3.2 miles roundtrip, and it is anticipated to route traffic west on NC 14/87, southeast on Old NC 87 (SR 1605), east on NC 700, and north on SR 1700 (see Figure 2). Initial coordination by NCDOT Community Studies (CS) involved sending input forms to the local EMS only, as there are no school buses using the bridge. The completed EMS forms were not returned to NCDOT CS as of July 2022 for completion of the DIST; NCDOT Environmental Policy staff followed up with EMS staff in December 2022 and were able to confirm that EMS staff do not anticipate any impacts to EMS services.

Pedestrian and Bicycle Accommodations

The portion of SR 1700 within the project limits is part of an on-road bicycle facility that "needs improvement." To accommodate this bike route, 4-foot paved shoulders will be added to SR 1700 within the project footprint, with a standard 42" F-shape concrete barrier rail on the bridge itself.

Protected Species

As of January 25, 2023, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service lists Roanoke logperch within the project study area. There are no streams or wetlands within the project study area, therefore this project will have No Effect on the species due to absence of habitat. The tricolored bat is proposed for listing but has not yet been officially listed.

Public Involvement

Landowner letters were sent in May of 2019 to property owners adjacent to the project. No responses or correspondence were received concerning the proposed project.

Native American Indian Tribe Protocols

There are two Native American Indian Tribes that identify Rockingham County as an area of interest and want to be notified of NCDOT's projects: the Catawba and Monacan Tribes. Per NCDOT's Tribal Coordination Protocols, NCDOT notified and requested comments from the Catawba Indian Nation and the Monacan Indian Nation in memos dated January 6, 2022.

The Monacan Indian Nation replied on January 27, 2022, indicating that they "do not wish to actively participate in this consultation project, because the project's impacts are anticipated to be minimal."

The Catawba Indian Nation replied on February 14, 2022, indicating that "the Catawba have no immediate concerns with regard to traditional cultural properties, sacred sites or Native American archeological sites within the boundaries of the proposed project areas."

Question 24 – Maintenance of traffic cause substantial disruption: There is an on-road bicycle facility that "needs improvement" within the project limits on Fisher Hill Road that will have to be detoured at least 3.2 miles during the construction of the project. Additionally, there is an existing bike route (Rockingham County Bike Route 2) that is to be part of the detour which will likely encounter increased motor vehicle traffic volumes during construction.

Question 30 – Prime Farmland located in project study area: The extent of any farmland will depend on the exact location of easements. However, no further action is needed at this time as the project is anticipated to remain state-funded. There are no VADs or EVADs in the project study area, and no active farmland is anticipated to be impacted.



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
