#### A. Project Description:

Pedestrian improvements and a right turn lane on the I-240 Eastbound off-ramp at Charlotte Street, Buncombe County, NC.

#### B. <u>Description of Need and Purpose:</u>

The project will reduce traffic congestion and increase pedestrian safety. The current interchange does not provide adequate storage and the pedestrian facilities need upgrades.

The project will construct crosswalks with pedestrian signals and add a turn lane to the east bound off ramp of I-240 at Charlotte Street (US 70). Total project length will be 0.21 mile.




