Project Description: The NCDOT proposes to repair and stabilize the roadway embankment/causeway and adjacent sidewalk along NC 24, immediately southeast of the White Oak River bridge, between Swansboro and Cedar Point, NC. These areas remain prone to future erosion and are anticipated to require ongoing maintenance.

Anticipated Permit or Consultation Requirements: Work will likely be permitted by the USACE using NWP 54 and an accompanying CAMA General Permit at Sites 1, 2A, and 2B. An Individual Permit and CAMA Major Permit may be required for Site 3.

Special Project Information: As part of the project, NCDOT would like to replace, enhance, and/or create adjacent shallow water marsh areas as a more resilient repair and stabilization solution. NCDOT has partnered with the NC Coastal Federation and SWCA Environmental Consultants. The team has been awarded a National Fish and Wildlife Federation (NFWF) grant to advance the state's resiliency goals by using living shoreline techniques to stabilize the shoreline to give added protection to the roadway embankment and restore/enhance marsh habitat at the affected sites.
