## A. Project Description:

The City of Greensboro is planning to construct approximately 4,000 feet of sidewalk along Farmington Drive in Greensboro, North Carolina. The City of Greensboro resides in Guilford County. The project will begin at the intersection of Farmington Drive with Gate City Boulevard and continues on both sides of the roadway to the intersection of Farmington Drive with Wintergarden Lane. From the intersection of Farmington Drive with Wintergarden Lane. From the north side of the roadway eastward, terminating at the intersection of Farmington Drive with South Holden Road. The project includes the addition of curb and gutter, a 2.5-foot grass strip, and a concrete sidewalk that varies in width from 5 to 6 feet. See Attachment A – Location Maps, Photographs & Typical Sections)

B. Description of Need and Purpose:

The purpose of this project is to facilitate and improve pedestrian access along Farmington Drive. The sidewalk will be constructed adjacent to existing roadways in areas that have been identified as lacking pedestrian accommodations or needing improved pedestrian accommodations. The project will provide safe and convenient pedestrian access, and will improve access and connectivity for underserved areas by extending sidewalk and by filling in key gaps in the sidewalk system. The infrastructure included in this project is identified in the 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) for the Greensboro Urban Area and are included in the adopted Greensboro 2015 Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Greenways Master Plan (BiPed).

## E. Special Project Information:

#### Threatened and Endangered Species

Threatened and Endangered Species reviews were performed on May 23, 2019 and October 21, 2019 by an environmental scientist with WithersRavenel (WR). The reviews included a pedestrian survey to assess vegetative communities and identify potential habitat for, or occurrences of, federally listed species within or immediately adjacent to the review area. The current federally listed species know to occur in Guilford County are the Cape Fear shiner (Endangered), the Roanoke logperch (Endangered), Schweinitz's sunflower (Endangered), small whorled pogonia (Threatened) and the bald eagle (Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act). Also, the Atlantic pigtoe is listed as an At Risk Species (Proposed Threatened).

The survey for federally listed threatened and endangered species resulted in a biological conclusion that activities within the review area will have "No Effect" on the Cape Fear shiner, the Roanoke logperch, Schweinitz's sunflower, small whorled pogonia, the bald eagle, and the Atlantic pigtoe due to either a lack of habitat or the lack of presence of the species.

The US Fish and Wildlife Service has developed a programmatic biological opinion (PBO) in conjunction with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), and NCDOT for the northern long-eared bat (NLEB) in eastern North Carolina. The PBO covers the entire NCDOT program in Divisions 1-8, including all NCDOT projects and activities. The programmatic determination for NLEB for the NCDOT program in Divisions 1-8 is "May Affect, Likely to Adversely Affect." The PBO will provide incidental take coverage for NLEB and will ensure compliance with Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act for five years for all NCDOT projects with a federal nexus in Divisions 1-8, which includes Guilford County, where the Project is located. This level of incidental take is authorized from the effective date of final listing through April 30, 2020.

#### Wetlands, Streams, and Buffers:

The site review did not identify any wetlands within the review area.

The site review identified one perennial stream (Stream 1) within the review area. Stream 1 is depicted on both the USGS Quadrangle and Soil Survey Maps. At this stream location, the sidewalk alignment was determined to be located entirely within the existing, filled ROW. Therefore, there are no impacts to the jurisdictional stream anticipated for construction of the sidewalk.

If proposed activities will result in either temporary or permanent impacts to Stream 1, authorization from the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and NC Division of Water Resources (NCDWR) will be required through Section 404/401 permitting.

The project is located within the Jordan Lake drainage basin (Haw River sub basin) and is subject to the Jordan Lake Riparian Buffer Rules. Since the proposed project is a City of Greensboro project, enforcement of the Jordan Lake Buffer Rules would default to NCDWR. Per the Jordan Lake Riparian Buffer Rules, any intermittent or perennial streams depicted on the USGS Quadrangle Maps or Guilford County Soil survey are subject to 50' riparian buffers.

There is one depicted feature within the review corridor consisting of one perennial stream. Based on the site review, the depicted feature was determined "present" in the field, and therefore is subject to riparian buffers. No other streams were identified within the review corridor or within 50' of the review area. Buffer subjectivity of the field verified depicted stream is conceded, and therefore formal Buffer Determination form NCDWR is not required.

## National Historic Preservation Act

The project does not propose to rehabilitate, alter, remove or demolish any historic property, and there is no proposed sale, transfer, or lease of historic properties within the project area. There are no SHPO entries in proximity to the project boundary.

The NC Department of Cultural Resources, State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has reviewed the proposed project. In their response letter dated October 28, 2019 (see Attachment B – SHPO Response), SHPO stated that they are aware of no historic resources which would be affected by the project and, therefore, have no comment on the project as proposed.

#### Right of Way/Easements, Section 4(f) and Section 6(f)

The proposed sidewalk will be located adjacent to the existing roadway, resulting in minimal impact to any front yard or commercial property. The project does not require the relocation of any residence or business, nor are any parking spaces being eliminated. The project requires the acquisition of 0.015 AC of right of way, 0.003 AC of permanent easement, and 0.435 AC of temporary construction easement. There are no Section 4(f) or Section 6(f) resources located within the project limits.

#### Environmental Commitments

A Transaction Screen Assessment (TSA) was performed for this project included site reconnaissance and review of ownership documents, aerial photographs, historical property uses, public records, the Environmental Data Resources (EDR) Report and the construction plans.

Based on the results of this environmental review and the scope of the proposed sidewalk improvements, it was determined that no sites appear to pose an environmental concern to the proposed sidewalk corridor.


