A. <u>Project Description:</u> The NC 63 Sidewalk project, State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Project U-5190, is located within the jurisdictional limits of the City of Asheville, in Buncombe County. The project includes planning for the construction of sidewalks along both sides of NC 63 (New Leicester Highway) from US 23/74 (Patton Avenue) to the western city limits near SR 1316 (Spivey Place), a distance of approximately 2.3 miles (refer to Figure 1).

The planned sidewalk section includes a 5-foot utility strip adjacent to the back of curb and a 5-foot sidewalk on both sides of the road. All signalized intersections will include Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant ramps and pedestrian signals.

B. Description of Need and Purpose:

The purpose of the proposed project is to improve pedestrian safety and mobility along NC 63 (Leicester Highway).

Question 8: Endangered Species

Northern long-eared bat

Habitat for the Northern long-eared bat exists in the project study area. A review of the January 2017 North Carolina Natural Heritage Program (NCNHP) database on February 27, 2017, indicates no known occurrences within 1.0 mile of the study area. The proposed action does not require separate USFWS consultation on the grounds that the proposed action is consistent with the final Section 4(d) rule, codified at 50 C.F.R. § 17.40(o) and effective February 16, 2016. Section 7 responsibilities are therefore considered fulfilled. A review of the USFWS Asheville Field Office website

(http://www.fws.gov/asheville/htmls/project_review/NLEB_in_WNC.html) was also conducted for consistency with NCNHP records. This project is located entirely outside of the highlighted areas (12-digit HUC) that the USFWS has determined to be representative of areas that may require consultation. Therefore, a biological conclusion of **"May Affect, Unlikely to Adversely Affect"** was determined for this species.
