SUBJECT: Start of Study and Scoping Meeting Notification for the Wadesboro Bypass in

Wadesboro, Anson County, North Carolina, TIP No. R-5878

NCDOT Project Management Unit is beginning the project development, environmental, and engineering studies for the R-5878 Wadesboro Bypass project. The project proposes to construct a freeway on new location which bypasses the Town of Wadesboro. The project is included in the North Carolina Department of Transportation's 2024-2033 State Transportation Improvement Program. Section B is scheduled for right of way in fiscal year 2028 and construction in fiscal year 2030, while Section A remains unfunded.





OTHER PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- Tanyard Branch, Goulds Fork, Culpepper Creek, Grindstone Branch, Brush Fork, Derita Creek, and Reedy Fork are 303d or 303b impaired streams located in the project study area.
- North Fork Jones Creek (City Pond) is directly south of the project study area and is classified as a HQW resource. Little Brown Creek flows on the west side of the project study area and merges with Brown Creek (a 303d-listed impaired stream) just beyond the study area boundary.
- There are 220 NC State Historic Preservation Office (NCHPO) resources listed within the project study area. These are primarily concentrated near the Wadesboro town limits. There are also six historic districts within the project study area as listed:
 - Wadesboro Downtown Historic District (NR)
 - Westview Cemetery (NR)
 - o Boggan-Hammond House and Alexander Little Wing (NR)
 - o Caudle Family House (T. Lamar Caudle House) (DOE)
 - Wade Manufacturing Company and Mill Village Historic District (DOE)
 - Valley Motor Court (DOE)
- Other community resources in project study area:
 - o 2 rail corridors (3 potential crossings)
 - 1 private airstrip
 - 5 utility solar facilities and 1 commercial solar facility¹
- Approximately 94 acres of Duke Power Transmission Easements located within the project study area.
- The following protected lands are located completely or partially within the project study area:
 - 17 NC Natural Heritage Program Managed Areas
 - 6 owned by Anson County

- A total of 841 crashes occurred along the existing US 74 corridor from SR 1249 (Prison Camp Road) to First Street in Lilesville (August 2018-July 2023).

 - 128 total truck crashes (15%)
 - The most prevalent type of truck crashes along the corridor are lane departure and frontal impact crashes.
 - The crash severities for truck related crashes:
 - 2 "severe injury" [A], 9 "evident injury" [B], 20 "possible injury" [C]
 - The study corridor has three locations currently on the 2023 NCDOT HSIP potentially hazardous intersection list:
 - SR 1733 (Camden Street): Statewide Rank: 410; Anson County Rank: 1.
 - SR 1136 (Park Road): Statewide Rank: 1,921; Anson County Rank: 7.
 - Anson Plaza Shopping Center: Statewide Rank: 2,257; Anson County Rank: 9.
