Subject: Application for Section 404 Nationwide 23 and 33 Permits, and Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the proposed replacement of Bridge No. 138 over Island Creek on SR 1109 in Stanly County, Federal Aid Project No. BRZ-1109(7); Division 10; TIP No. B-4818; Debit \$240 from WBS 38588.1.1.

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) proposes to replace Bridge No. 138 over Island Creek on SR 1109. There will be 93 linear feet of permanent stream impact and 0.01 acre of temporary stream impact associated with the replacement of this structurally deficient and functionally obsolete structure.

Please see enclosed copies of the Pre-Construction Notification (PCN), EEP mitigation acceptance, permit drawings, stormwater management plan, design plans, and jurisdictional determination for the above referenced project. The Programmatic Categorical Exclusion (PCE) was completed in July 2012. Documents were distributed shortly thereafter. Additional copies are available upon request.

This project calls for a letting date of December 17, 2013 and a review date of October 29, 2013.

This impact will result in 47 linear feet of pemanent stream impact by way of "drying"/ rerouting the UT.

There will also be 0.005 acre of temporary impact to Island Creek by way of a temporary work pad to construct the 4' base

ditch, which will carry the new reach of the Northern UT to Island Creek, as well as temporary causeway impact to Island Creek for the removal/ installation of the new bent.

Site 2- the Southern UT to Island Creek, two impacts:

1. The extension of a 30" RCP to accommodate the wider shoulders leading up to the wider bridge.

2. The UT will be re-routed away from the bridge end bent/ rip rap and emptying downstream of the bridge.

Both of these impacts total 46 linear feet of permanent stream impact. There will also be <0.01 acre of temporary impact to Island Creek by way of a temporary work pad to contruct the 2' base ditch to carry the new reach of the Southern UT to Island Creek.

Department of Environment and Natural Resources' Ecosystem Enhancement Program In-Lieu Fee Instrument dated July 28, 2010. If the above referenced impact amounts are revised, then this mitigation acceptance letter will no longer be valid and a new mitigation acceptance letter will be required from EEP.

### **ROADWAY DESCRIPTION**

The project involves the replacement of bridge number 138 over Island Creek on SR 1109 (Philadelphia Church Rd.) in Stanly County. The overall length of the project is 0.095 mile. The project will replace an existing 60 foot length bridge with a new 80 foot two-span 21" cored slab bridge. An off-site detour will be required.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL DESCRIPTION**

The project is located within the Yadkin – Pee Dee River Basin. The proposed bridge is over Island Creek which is classified as Class C waters.

Approximately 0.01 acre of surface water will be permanently impacted and 0.012 acre will be temporarily impacted.


### BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES AND MAJOR STRUCTURES

Best Management Practices (BMPs) and measures used in the project are non-structural and are an attempt to reduce the storm water impacts to the receiving stream due to erosion and runoff as well as attenuate and disperse storm water before entering the receiving waters. Bridge deck drains will be used on the eastern most side of the proposed bridge and will not be allowed to directly discharge into the water.

Polly Lespinasse of the Division of Water Quality (DWQ) visited the site on March 31, 2009, in order to provide verification of potential jurisdictional streams previously identified by your consulting firm for the above referenced project. These streams were evaluated for applicability to the mitigation rules set forth in [15A NCAC 2H .0506(h)]. The maps containing the project corridor were provided in the jurisdictional verification package received by this office on February 11, 2009. The jurisdictional features (streams and wetlands) are approximated on these maps.

Based on the field verification of the **streams** located within the project boundaries, a change was made to one (1) determination and is outlined below:

Stream S1 (Unnamed tributary to Island Creek): This stream was originally classified as ephemeral for the entire reach within the project boundaries (DWQ Stream Identification Form score of 16.5). Based on the site visit, this stream will be classified as intermittent from the origin to Flag S17. DWQ staff re-evaluated the reach using the DWQ Stream Identification Form and the stream received a score of 20.5 (additional points received from hydrology and biology). Please note that isopods and amphipods were identified throughout the reach and crayfish were observed in the stream from Flag S16 downstream. Additionally, the stream will be classified as perennial from Flag S17 to the tributary's confluence with Island Creek. presence of biology (salamanders and crayfish).

Based on the site reviews of the jurisdictional determinations made by your consulting firm, DWQ will consider the stream sites identified in the jurisdictional verification package, and revisions identified above, as accurate. Please note that the DWQ staff did not conduct a verification of wetland boundaries on this project.

This letter only addresses the applicability to the mitigation rules and does not approve any activity within buffers, Waters of the United States, or Waters of the State. Any impacts to wetlands, streams and buffers must comply with 404/401 regulations, water supply regulations (15A NCAC 2B .0216), applicable buffer rules, and any other required federal, state and local regulations. Please be aware that even if no direct impacts are proposed to any protected buffers, sheet flow of all new stormwater runoff as per 15A NCAC 2B .0250 is required.

Landowners or affected parties that dispute a determination made by the DWQ or Delegated Local Authority that a surface water exists and that it is subject to the mitigation rules may request a determination by the Director.
