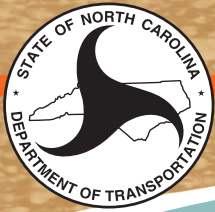
NCDOT is in the final stage of the planning process for the replacement of Bridge No. 29 over Cub Creek on SR 1001—Oakwood Road. The existing bridge will be replaced with a new structure to the west (toward Cub Creek Park). This alternative will allow for traffic to be maintained on the existing bridge during construction as well as allow for future widening to the east if needed.

The existing structure will be widened to include two travel lanes, bike lanes, and a protected pedestrian walkway. The structure will be raised to allow for a greenway access under the bridge along the north side of Cub Creek.

The proposed location of the new bridge will require the existing pedestrian bridge over Cub Creek, west of the existing bridge, to be removed prior to beginning construction. To reduce impacts to the park, pedestrian access through the area will not be maintained during construction.

The final footprint for the project will require acquisition of park property protected by Section 4(f) of the Department of Transportation Act of 1966 as well as Section 6(f) of the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965, as amended. NCDOT is seeking a de minimis determination for the Section 4 (f) impact as well as purchasing conversion property for the replacement of Section 6 (f) property impacted by this project located along the western side of Cub Creek Park.
